John Harper is a committee member and Emeritus Professor of Applied Mathematics, Victoria University of Wellington. His topic is:

Transits of Venus

As there will be a transit of Venus the day after the meeting and there will be no more for over 100 years John's talk is very appropriate. It will emphasise matters of historical interest rather than astronomical technicalities and cover questions such as: What are they? When do they occur? Why are they important enough for expeditions to be sent to observe them? Why did Karori's most eminent historian ask the speaker about them? What does one see? How was New Zealand affected?
