He canvassed the early history of the fortress and how thought had been given to its presence in the mid 1930's and after the outbreak of war, especially with the entry of Japan in late 1941, its construction has proceeded with the installation of two nine inch guns out of the three planned for.

An interesting presentation on this aspect of Karori's history especially as there are still aspects of it today that are open for viewing.
