Guest speaker

Our guest speaker was David Watt, Senior Outreach Advisor at Regional Services, Heritage NZ, who shared a presentation outlining the threats and opportunities with heritage in the Wellington region. David shared success stories outlining the value of heritage buildings and the opportunities their redevelopment can bring, using his extensive involvement with owners of heritage properties on conservation issues and coordinating heritage events around the Wellington region.

After his presentation David was keen to discuss with the Society further thoughts on historic places in Karori that could be visited as a heritage trail, either for the Wellington Heritage Festival, or as a standalone tour run by KHS. There are only a few heritage listed properties in Karori— apart from the churches and the cemetery and St Mary's Church and heritage sites in Makara. However, the size and age of our suburb means that there is wide representation of both architectural styles and different architects who practiced in Wellington (and further afield), so this is something we will consider for the future. It would be great to be able to develop an architectural walking tour for our members.
